



Essential information about a boat trip on lake Königssee

General information:



- All-year boat operation in heated electro boats (except on december 24th and if sea is frozen)
- After the first departure the boats leave approx. every 30 minutes. During the peak season with a large number of visitors boats depart approx. every 15 minutes.
 - One-way ride approx. 35 minutes to St. Bartholomä and approx. 55 minutes to Salet. Please take note of the departure times of the last boats from St. Bartholomä and Salet, as there is no foothpath back to Seelände Königssee.
- Kessel: This request stop is the starting point for a wide range of mountain tours. Please tell the you would like to disembark in Kessel.

 Mountaineers wishing to travel from Kessel to Königssee (Seelände) will find an orange coloured sliding panel at the jetty. This sliding board will show the skipper that there are passengers waiting to be picked up.
- The boats have no gastronomy and toilet facilities on board.
- There is a toilet and a disabled WC closed to the Königssee departure point (looking towards the lake, 1st boat shed on the left).
- In St. Bartholomä and Salet you will find toilets near the waiting area on the landing stage. There is also a disabled WC in St. Bartholomä. This is located in a restaurant outhouse looking toward the national park info point.
- Transporting prams and wheelchairs is generally not a problem. However, the special structure of our electrically powered boats means that space is limited.
- It is now compulsory for all dogs to wear muzzles, regardless of breed or size. We do not accept any attack dog breeds for transportation.
- Unfortunately, we cannot transport electrically powered wheelchairs because the way they are constructed means they cannot be rolled over the steps. However, you can borrow a mechanical wheelchair at the ticket office of Königssee (there is only a limited number available).
- The footpath in St. Bartholomä and the path from landing stage Salet to Obersee is easy and suitable for wheelchairs.
- A limited number of lockers are available at the ticket office of Königssee. You can safety lock your helmet and other equipment.
- Free wireless network connection at Seelände Königssee.
- You could also rent a rowing boat.

An open word about waiting times:

Even when all boats are in operation, you may have to wait before embarking on the outward or return journey during the holiday periods (especially July to mid-September), on public holidays and at long weekends as pleasant weather will draw larger numbers of passengers. Experience has shown that passenger numbers are particularly high on the first sunny day after a rainy period during the peak season. On these days, you are advised to make the journey to St. Bartholomä before 10.00 am and to embark on the return journey from St. Bartholomä not later than 2.30 pm.

Prices:

- Children up to age of 5 accompanied by an adult member of family are free of charge.
- Children from 6 to 17 years get 50 % discount (rounded up to the nearest 10 cents).
- Great prices our **family discounts**: When accompanied by an adult paying the full price (Mum, Dad, Grandma or Grandpa), the first child/grandchild (between 6 and 17 years) travels at the children's rate, all other children/grandchildren between 6 and 17 years travel for just 1 Euro each.
- Group rate: Groups of 20 or more people paying the full price receive a discount of 10 % (rounded up to the nearest 10 cents) off the normal rate for round trips for trips to St. Bartholomä or to Salet and back.
- **BGL-dailyticket or GutenTagTicket** (from the Bayerischen Regionalbahn and the public busses "RVO"): 5 % discount for the trips to St. Bartholomä or Salet and back (only for adults).
